Decriminalize Sex Work

National Forum “Why Decriminalize Sex Work?”

You are cordially invited to a FIRST Public Forum, Wed., June 11, 2008

VANCOUVER — Adult sex work should be fully decriminalized in Canada to advance women's equality and protect their safety, according to FIRST, a new national coalition of feminists. FIRST is inviting the public to learn more about decriminalization and the health and safety of sex workers at an open forum.

Keynote speaker Dr. Frances Shaver of Concordia University is a national authority on the present-day harms of Canada's prostitution laws. "All of the research I have conducted since appearing before the Fraser Committee over 20 years ago has served to strengthen my original position on the need for social and legal reform based on decriminalization," says Dr. Shaver.

FIRST says that by decriminalizing sex work, many of the harms associated with the current sex industry can be reduced or eliminated, including the abuse and violence. As highlighted by one of the speakers, Kate Shannon of the BC Centre for Excellence in HIV/AIDS, "Our recent research findings highlight the negative impacts of Canada's prostitution laws on the ability of street-based sex workers to safely negotiate condom use, or access health and support services."

"This forum is an opportunity for FIRST to bring the experts together and tell the public the true story of the negative effects of the law," says Tamara O'Doherty, spokesperson for FIRST.
